



RULES for Canadian Math Kangaroo Contest Awards

Eligibility for Awards

- Students must compete in only one grade, which is equal or higher than their school grade in mathematics.
- Proof of grade may be requested once a student is determined to be eligible for an award.
- Students must place in the top 50% percentile nationally.
- Names published on the website subject to the CMCK discretion.
- The CMKC corporation reserves the right to not give awards if participation was not supervised or there was evidence of misconduct and/or dishonesty.

Awards

The following types of awards in the Canadian Math Kangaroo Contest are available:

National Awards

1. For each school grade, the students with the highest three scores in Canada receive First, Second and Third Place Award. In case of ties, all students with the same result receive the award. These students will receive a plaque indicating the achievement.
2. All students who place in the top 6% of the participants nationwide receive a National Gold Medal.
3. All students who place in the top 8% of the participants nationwide receive a National Silver Medal.
4. All students who place in the top 10% of the participants nationwide receive a National Bronze Medal.

Note: Students who place in the top 10% nationally are eligible to receive only one of the above awards.

Regional Awards

1. For each grade, the students with the best three scores in a Region will receive First, Second and a Third Place White Ribbon Award. In case of ties, all students with the same result receive the award.
2. For each grade, the student who place in the top 10% in a Region will receive a Red Ribbon of Excellence.

Note: Students who receive a white ribbon will not be eligible for a red ribbon.

Certificates

All students who place regionally and nationally for awards will receive a certificate indicating the student's achievement.

Special Recognition

The Special Recognitions for Outstanding Results are monetary awards (\$1000 or \$500 or \$250) given to Grade 12 students who have demonstrated continued participation and exceptional results in the Canadian Math Kangaroo Contest. The CMKC corporation reserves the right to not give awards if, in a given year, participation was not supervised or there was evidence of misconduct and/or dishonesty.
